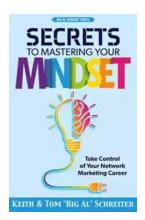
We had time for zip-lining in the jungle, biking in Angkor Wat, and snorkeling off

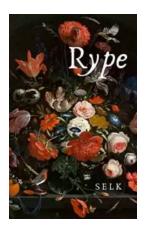
