




Illustration for "The Horla" - Guy de Maupassant




Illustration for "The Little Frenchman and His Water Lots" - Mark Twain




Illustration for "A Simple Soul" - Gustave Flaubert




Illustration for "The Legend of St. Julian the Hospitaller" - Gustave Flaubert



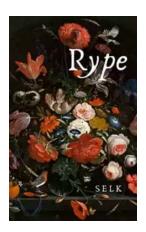
